Course Objectives	Study of the basic principles of planning and design of buildings for individual housing. Knowledge and understanding the basic types of buildings for individual housing, spatial and programmatic characteristics, their historical and contemporary contexts and development of the ability to plan them, programming and design.
Course Learning Outcomes	The content of the case is the individual family house and the accompanying types of low residential construction. Family housing: the evolution of housing (historical, social, cultural, morphological, typological aspects); from the villa in the modern age to the new simplicity of the one-family house; models of town houses: classic concept - Palladio, spatial plan - Los, free plan - Le Corbusier; houses in nature; design principles; shaping procedures. Review of prototypes and recent projects. Housing in a low dense residential structure: double, in a row, in a bunch, etc. : typology; aspects of grouping, urban patterns, approaches; apartment concepts, interrelationships
Course Contents	Inquiring the examples and applications of the principles of basic design (repetition, relevance, contrast, sovereignty, hierarchy, equilibrium) and design organization.
